

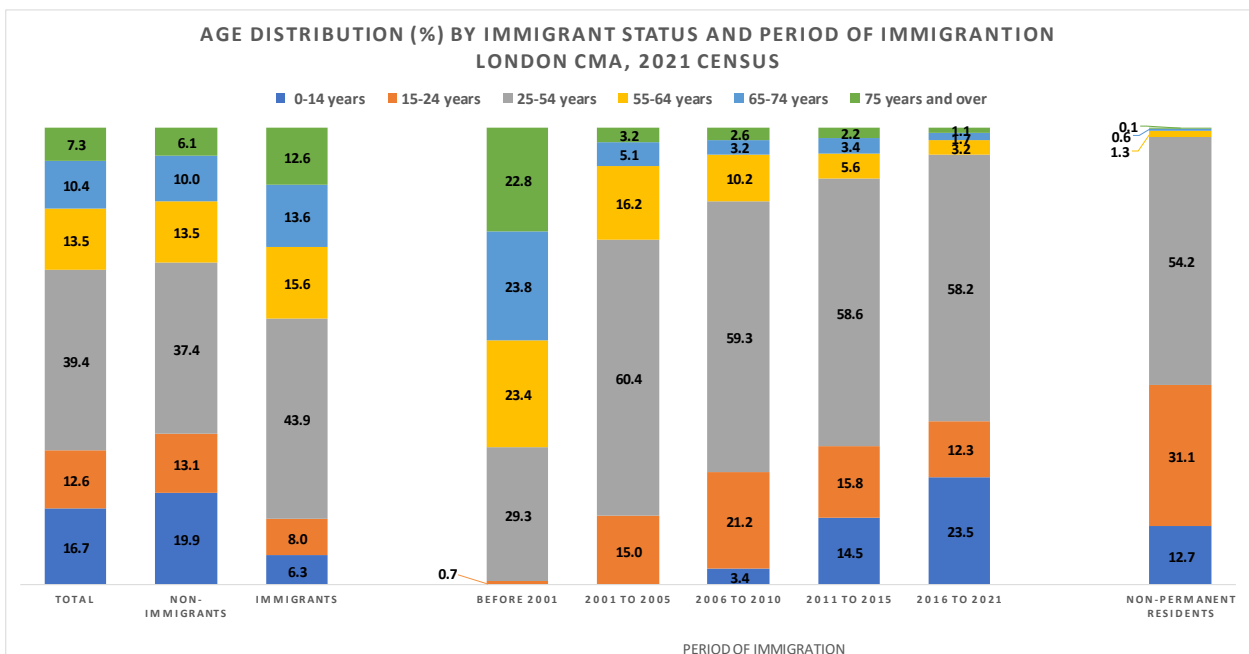
Did you know?

Immigrants are aging, but recent immigration makes population younger

Matter of Facts Series - Part 24

In 2021, almost half of the 58,715* immigrants who arrived before 2001, are aged 65 and over: 24% aged 65 to 74 years, and 23% 75 years and over. In contrast, of the more recent immigrants who arrived 2016-2021, only 3% are aged 65 and older, and as many as 36% are younger than 25 years old.

- Among the 400,620 non-immigrants, 10% are aged 65 to 74 years, and 6% are 75 years and older
- Around 60% of immigrants who arrived between 2001 to 2021 are aged 25 to 54 years old
- Immigrants in 2016 to 2021 have the highest percentage (24%) of children aged 0 to 14
- Non-permanent residents have the highest percentage (31%) aged 15 to 24 years old
